
Listening problems

- Children with listening troubles can
 - Be cheeky at home
 - Make lots of demands
 - Get into trouble at school
 - May bully other children
 - Be very shy
 - Think they are dumb



Angry

- Family can get upset
- think they are being cheeky and may 'flog' them
- not know they have trouble understanding



Sad

- think the problems are because they are not looking after children the right way
- feel they have let children down



 This book tells the story about children with listening problems and what families can do to help them.




How we hear



How do we hear?


- Sound is caught by the outside part of the ear and moves down the ear tunnel to the eardrum.
- The sound makes the eardrum shake, which moves some small bones.
- The small bones help send the sound into the brain.
- The brain then works out what the sound is.



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How do listening problems happen?

- Otitis media-lots of kids get it.
- pus and stops sound getting to the brain.
- Holes in eardrum make it hard to hear and give kids runny ears






Conductive hearing loss



- When sound can't get through properly it is called conductive hearing loss (CHL).
- hard to understand and learn.




How many kids have it?

- In many Aboriginal communities most children have it




What happens when kids can't hear well?

Hard learning

- It is hard to learn at school

- Get into trouble for talking.



Talking too much

- Talk a lot
 - People can get angry




Bossing and bullying

- Boss other kids and even adults.
- Bullying.



Being quiet and shy

 Very shy and won't answer when people talk to them



Worrying

- Worry a lot about being shamed
- Picked on by other kids.



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Being good



• To be helpful so accepted



Needing help



- Family talks for them
- Ask "what will happen"



Watching how other kids do things


- Often watch what other kids do
- Walk around the classroom
- Teachers think they are not paying attention





Knowing what will happen

- Like to know what is going to happen.
- Know what to expect.

Not showing respect

• People may think they are being lazy or not showing respect.



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More problems at school than home


- More problems at school:

 - Schools teach by just talking




Sport

Keep away from smoke









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
Wash

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Showing




- Spend more time helping

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When talking:




- Get close
- Can see your face




Noise

Check understanding



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
Let them know

- Play games with rules and taking turns




Help kids understand:

- Feel good about what they do well.




Talk to people about what is in this book:
